Alumna Profile - Samantha King Talks 'Toons

When Samantha King, a 2009 graduate of Guerin Catholic High School and an alumna of the California Institute of the Arts steps into her office at Cartoon Network in Burbank, Calif., she's really getting ready to play. "That's what it seems like sometimes," says King, who has worked as a story revisionist on the show *Clarence* since July. "There's a mirror in my office, so if I need to draw a character with a funny look on his face, I can practice making different expressions in the mirror before creating the one I think will work." For



those unfamiliar with the cartoon, *Clarence* is about a typical boy and his friends who sport typical boy mentalities, says King. "I was a fan before I started because the cartoon shows kids as kids – not sweet angels but kids dealing with real-world things – homework, bullying, pulling pranks or just being gross because they can be. How gross? "Well, I've had to figure out how to draw vomit..." King explains that story artists work with a team to create episodes and pose out each shot. After a first review, the drawings go to King, who fixes or changes shots as directed. Basically, a revisionist is an apprentice to the story artists, she adds.

King, the daughter of Chyrise and Roch King, has wanted to be an animator since she was a sophomore at Guerin Catholic. "I always liked all kinds of art – theatre, music and drawing. With animation, I can incorporate all of those into my work." Still, King acknowledges that it's not easy working in the arts. "My parents were supportive, but my dad wanted assurance that I could be successful. I'm lucky that this industry is pretty secure." King hopes to continue working in animation and someday pitch her own show. She offers advice to others pursuing degrees or jobs in the arts. "There's no one specific path," King says. "Just keep trying to find your way. I had to work a bunch of rough jobs before I got what I wanted, and you may have to do other things to support your dream, but that's okay. Just give it up to the Lord, and know He'll get you there. King believes the arts are especially important in our world today. "As humans, we all have some kind of arduous journey ahead of us, but through the arts, we can connect with and support each other, and we can make a difference. For me, drawing helps me focus on the positive side of life."

Student Studio Productions = On-the-Job Leadership Training



When Jack Titus, a 2014 Guerin Catholic graduate approached Media Center Specialist Marcia Murphy about a summer Student Studio Production, she made sure he understood the work involved. "We try to let the students take complete control of these productions from writing to directing to figuring out costumes to solving problems. The point of student studios is to build better leaders. The adults let the students figure things out for themselves, and it can be really tough." That didn't stop Titus, who proceeded to write a script for his play *Tangled under the Sea*, direct 41 cast members and pack the house every night of the show. Murphy shouldn't have worried. "Jack is

incredibly professional. He was very organized and handled every aspect like a pro. The best part was watching him watch his show and realize the fruits of his labors." Now, two more productions are underway, and several new student directors are following in Titus's footsteps. Currently, Molly Moran and Grace Warns, the co-directors of *Detention Never Ends*, are a little stressed about finding the right costumes and making sure everyone knows their lines. "I'm new to directing, so I've had to learn as I go," says Moran. "But we're figuring it out, and it's so much fun."

Rejoice! Carmel Deanery Choral Festival Rocks the House



For the seventh year, Guerin Catholic High School hosted *Rejoice!*, its Carmel Deanery Choral Festival outreach program on September 27. Nearly 250 singers in third through eighth grade from St. Maria Goretti, Our Lady of Grace, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and St. Louis de Montfort, joined fifty Guerin Catholic high schoolers for a day of music and praise. According to GCHS Fine Arts Director Mark Duray, the festival "brings us together as a community of musicians and celebrates what makes us family."



Throughout the day, singers broke into small groups to get to know one another and learn five musical selections with Duray and other deanery directors including Emily Clark, (SLDM), Janie Richardt, (SMG), Joey Garcia, (OLG) and Larry Krauser (OLMC) before ending the day with a concert.



The students were very focused on the music. Our Lady of Grace third grader Avery Wilson couldn't wait to finish lunch and get back to singing. "It's exciting because I get to learn about new songs and get to meet new people," Wilson said. "I really like *Turn the World Around* because Mr. Garcia taught it, and it's a really fun rhythm." Sammy Mirande, a seventh grader from St. Maria Goretti wasn't

as quick to dismiss lunch. "My favorite part is the cookies," he said. "My next favorite part is singing with other people my age and giving a concert to show our parents what we can do."

The students left with some inspirational words from Mr. Duray. "There's a lot of music out there. Some of it's good; some of it's bad. We need better choices. We need some better music. Who is going to give that to us? You are. Singing can bring you closer to Christ, and that's what it's all about."



Why We've Created the GCFAA - "Truth in Beauty"



The Guerin Catholic Fine Arts program exists to illuminate the mission of Guerin Catholic High School by seeking the Lord's "Truth in Beauty" through education, performance, design and exhibit. One quarter of the Guerin Catholic student body participates in at least one fine arts group or event each year. Since the founding of Guerin Catholic, we have witnessed hundreds of our student-artists hone their Godgiven talents and turn those talents to the world.

We pray that as we move forward in our purpose, with God's grace and our humility, we can continue to be His instruments, revealing His Truth in beauty through our students' artistry. Through their efforts, we hope to create a force of goodness for a

world in need. Whether our students perform in vocal or instrumental ensembles, plays, musicals, Comedy Sportz, talent shows, or community events or provide music ministry support for school and diocesan liturgies, their creative gifts are priceless. However, providing them with the opportunities to use their gifts gets expensive. I've listed a few examples:

- Purchasing one wireless microphone \$500
- Cleaning all of our choir robes almost \$1500
- Buying one choir robe \$250
- Tuning one piano \$110 (we have four that need to be tuned three times a year)
- Buying one piece of sheet music \$2 (we need to buy 70 pieces for one song for GoldenVoice)
- Renting a bus to take a choir to perform at ISSMA \$400
- Purchasing a music folder for one student \$8.75
- Providing one meal for a musical cast and crew on a performance night \$100 to \$150
- Replacing key pads on a saxophone \$400
- Licensing a Broadway musical script and score for performance at school \$3,000

In addition to financial support, our talented students need your time. We need volunteers to sell event tickets and concessions, make costumes, create sets, provide hospitality for receptions and cast/crew events, help communicate about fine arts events, chaperone trips, supervise back stage, maintain contact e-mail lists and help with countless other tasks involved in creating a successful fine arts program.

That's where the newly formed Guerin Catholic Fine Arts Alliance (GCFAA) comes into play. GCFAA provides the crucial time, talent and treasure necessary to support the efforts of our student-artists. It also helps to increase the awareness of our fine arts program and the powerful value it brings to our community.
