The Class of 2021 earned over \$34 million in college scholarship awards with 25 percent of the class earning an International Baccalaureate diploma. Speakers at the ceremony included student Katie LaReau '21 and beloved Science Department Chair, Dr. Jeanine Conklin, who challenged and inspired countless Golden Eagles during her 14 year tenure at Guerin Catholic. 

LIFELONG LEARNING WITH NEW GC LEARNER ATTRIBUTES

Beginning with the 2021-22 school year Guerin Catholic introduced the **GC Learner Attributes**. GC Learner Attributes focus on the whole child with an emphasis on lifelong learning.

Faculty and staff are using the GC Learner
Attributes throughout the school year to guide
conversations in Kairos, classrooms and other
activities to help build upon shared school culture.
Each month there is a focus on a different attribute,
highlighting how students model it already or
where areas of growth can be.

The Holy See's Teaching on Catholic Schools states the purpose of Catholic education: "The specific purpose of a Catholic education is the formation of boys and girls who will be good citizens of this world, loving God and neighbor and enriching society with the leaven of the gospel, and who will also be citizens of the world to come, thus fulfilling their destiny to become Saints."

"We are preparing and forming these souls who have been entrusted to us, not just for our world today, but for so much more," said Mrs. Christine Williams, Assistant Principal and Director of Academics. INQUIRER


We nurture our curiosity, developing skills for inquiry and research. We know how to learn independently and with others. We learn with enthusiasm and sustain our love of learning throughout life.



DeBoy has two years, rather than the customary one, to fulfill his proposal: "Embracing Beauty in Conservation, Creation and Conversation." This entails commuting to school by bicycle, traveling with his wife, Megan, and two sons, Owen and Maxwell, to the State of Washington and back for 45 days of hiking, camping, and biking while reconnecting with distant friends and family, and promoting with students a "Bike to School Day" at Guerin Catholic through a student club.

With more time to realize the proposal, DeBoy scaled back the camping leg of the journey for the summer of 2021. "This past summer we camped and cycled up and down the Blue Star highway along Lake Michigan. Next summer, we'll head to Bellingham, Washington by way of Colorado and Oregon and return through Montana and Minnesota."


On the cusp of spring, eager to resume commuting by bike, DeBoy dusted off his 2006 Specialized Hard Rock on a 20 degree morning and began completing the 4.5 mile commute three days a week. "As I noted in my proposal, the timing was Providential. The city of Carmel



DeBoy's daily bike commute elevates his energy and attitude, better equipping him to serve students. He also knows that stories from his upcoming adventures will trickle into his teaching. Story has always played a big role in his practice from building relationships, to providing comic relief, to anchoring a key concept in metaphor, or in an emotional response best evoked through anecdote. "One of the Guerin Catholic Learner Attributes is risk taker. With early attempts at the timed essay, I'm not asking students to take the same risk, but I am encouraging them to more consciously take a process-related or rhetorical risk with some sense of the reward it could reap. To punctuate this goal with an anecdote, I might ask kids to avoid, for example, taking an unconscious risk like, as a hypothetical example, that of some teacher biking through a forest north of Michigan's Sleeping Bear Dunes, dressed in black and green, oblivious that it's hunting season. The reward of looking all chic in green isn't worth it, and he's not even aware that he's taking a risk at all. This is like the student submitting a timed essay with 25 minutes to spare. Why not instead risk over gathering evidence, or overplanning the scope and sequence of ideas, or over annotating the featured excerpt, or spending too long developing the body so that there's not enough time for a conclusion or to proofread? Don't be that guy in green biking amongst hunters! Take a strategic risk!"

Of course, God is the source of all beauty, and DeBoy is grateful for the varied abundance of beauty he has encountered in the community of Guerin Catholic over the past nine years and in the parents, colleagues, and students throughout his twenty years of teaching. He is also grateful to the Lilly Creativity Program for affording him and his family opportunities to encounter varied forms of beauty. God-willing, the adventure will help fuel another twenty years of teaching and lead to a constellation of goodness here and elsewhere.







BOYS LACROSSE

A SEASON TO REMEMBER

The 2021 boys lacrosse team will be remembered for years to come as the 1A state champion, as well as finishing with a 13-4 record and capturing the the Circle City Conference championship for a second consecutive year. Luke Abell '21 was named Guerin Catholic's 3rd US Lacrosse All-American and the group of Raph Rainey '21, Luke Abell '21, Cooper Navarro '24, Thomas Berger '21, Charlie Stordy '22, Max McGreal '21 and Joseph Lafiosca '21 were named either All-State or All-Class.

After a Final Four appearance in 2019 and a canceled season in 2020, the boys lacrosse team remained at the top of the rankings all year. The tournament run included wins over Park Tudor, #5 Heritage Christian and #2 ranked South Bend St. Joseph in the state championship.

The team is led by Head Coach Charlie Barry and his staff members Joe Gillis, Mike Mewborn, Rob Causey, Spencer Weller '14 and 2021 IHSLA Assistant Coach of the Year Wally Schaefer.



The team went 11-1 in 18 hole matches, spent much of the year ranked #1, won the Regional Championship



for the first time and finished runner-up at the IHSAA State Championship. The team was led by Ben Burgan '21, Jack Sciaudone '21, Christian Hein '21 and Andrew White '21. The team had terrific play from underclassmen as well as Connor McNeely '22, Jacob Modleski '23 and Leo Wessel '24 all contributed in significant ways throughout the year. ■



PFEFFERKORN SISTERS SET STANDARD FOR SUCCESS

Guerin Catholic graduate **Angelica Pfefferkorn** '20 and sister **Christina Pfefferkorn** '22 have been instrumental in the rise of the girls golf program over the past several years. Angelica finished 8th overall at the 2019 IHSAA Girls Golf State Finals and was a key contributor to the first State Finals appearance for the girls golf team in 2018. She also earned the 2020 Guerin Catholic Female Athlete of the Year award. Angelica is now playing at Oklahoma State where she earned the distinction of the 2021 Academic All Big 12 Rookie team with a 4.0 in Pre-Med Studies.

Christina wrapped up her Guerin Catholic golf career this past October at the IHSAA State Finals where she became the first student-athlete in school history to compete in the State Finals four years in a row. During the 2021 season, she finished as the medalist on 8 separate occasions with a 75.0 scoring average. While her college plans are undecided, her humble, yet competitive approach will leave a legacy on the girls golf team for years to come.

ROSARY ART

The Guerin Catholic Art Club was busy this summer painting a beautiful rosary around the walls of the Media Center. PROCLAIMING BEAUTY

DEAR THEATRE ALUMNI:

"God saw all that he had made, and it was very good" (Gn 1:31)



Reflecting on the beauty of Guerin Catholic theatre over the last 17 years, it is really quite amazing to recall all of the amazing shows that have been written, directed, and performed all in our small cafetorium! So many shows, so many students, so many memories.

When I think back, many times I was flying by the seat of my pants. Although I have been in the arts all my life, Guerin Catholic provided the first opportunity for me to direct a show. During those early shows, I was so focused on the "what"—the acting, dancing, singing, building and performing—that I never took time to reflect on the "why." When I became the Director of Fine Arts in 2018, I stumbled upon St. John Paul II's 1999 Letter to the Artist. Over the last few years, I have spent time each week contemplating parts of this letter. The letter has not

only inspired me, but given me a better understanding of why what we do in art, music, and theatre is so important to a Catholic education and to the world!

Alumni—let me tell you now what I wasn't capable of telling you then: You were creating beauty! Together we dipped our feet in the [...infinite Ocean of beauty where wonder becomes awe, exhilaration, unspeakable joy.]¹ St. Augustine said it best, "Does God proclaim Himself in the wonders of creation? No. All things proclaim Him, all things speak. Their beauty is the voice by which they announce God, by which they sing, "It is you who made me beautiful, not me myself but you." In writing, directing, or performing in one of these shows you were able to participate in one of the greatest gifts that God shares with us—the ability to create! "With loving regard, the divine Artist passes on to the human artist a spark of his own surpassing wisdom, calling him to share in his creative power." By allowing us to create God shares some of the power He used when called the universe into being from the darkness. We were actively involved with the divine and we didn't even know it!

Maybe after graduation from Guerin Catholic, you didn't go on to become a great painter, a member of a band, or a performer on Broadway, but every day you have the opportunity to continue to participate in this great gift. In whatever career you landed, you create more than you realize. You cook, you sing, you take photos, and many of you have had children. Having a child allows you to reflect on the act of creation in a different way. And with your children, whether you know it or not, you help them participate in the act of creating beauty. I know it because I see it when you post videos of your children singing, post recital photos, or re-create scenes from their favorite movies! I love to see this legacy of creation continue with your children. It is truly the beauty that the world longs for.

One of my all-time favorite quotes is, "If you are who God created you to be, you will set the whole world on fire" by St. Catherine of Siena. Choosing to go to high school at Guerin Catholic was the beginning of me saying yes to being who God made me to be. I vividly remember the very first day of my freshmen year. My dad drove me to school and when we pulled up to the entrance I told him I didn't want to get out of the car. I can't imagine what my life would look like today if he hadn't encouraged me to step out of the car and walk into the building. It was within Guerin Catholic's walls that my heart for God and others developed. I found peers, my best friends to this day, that had different strengths and weaknesses than me, but challenged me to be the best version of myself. My worldview was slowly changed from facing internally to externally. The values that teachers exemplify to students, namely Mrs. Shelley Horn's compassion or Mrs. Marcia Murphy's joy, and the numerous service opportunities like the Because We Are Grateful day helped form this worldview. By the time I walked across the stage to be handed my diploma, I found myself asking questions to God like, "Why am I here today? What do you want me to do today to serve you? How do you want me to do it?"

These questions led me to ultimately taking a big detour from the plans I had after college (pursuing a Masters in Counseling), to instead saying yes to serving as a FOCUS Missionary. FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) is a Catholic collegiate outreach whose mission is to share the hope and joy of the gospel with college students. Through Bible studies, outreach events, mission trips, and one-on-one discipleship, missionaries inspire and build up students in the faith, teaching them how to share the good news.

Students encounter many learning experiences during the college years, but the biggest growth often transcends that which students learn in a classroom. During these critical years of identity formation and personal growth, college students are looking for meaning and purpose to their lives. No matter what I came across, whether a student experiencing an unplanned pregnancy to another who was trying to understand where God fit in their life, I knew God was there providing for me just like He did with St. Theodore Guerin.

Through FOCUS I met my amazing husband, Joe. We reside in Tuscaloosa, Alabama where I serve as the FOCUS Team Director at the University of

Alabama (Roll Tide!). Six months into our marriage, we began trying to grow our



family with no success. For a few years we embraced many doctor's appointments, lifestyle changes, and a few surgeries to try and get to the root of what was wrong. It was a season of praying, crying, doubting, and declaring promises with faith. My time at Guerin Catholic was instrumental in teaching me who the person of Jesus is and how to have a relationship with Him. Because of this I had the foundation to make it through one of the hardest seasons I had ever experienced.

Eventually, Joe and I started to research, read, and google about all things adoption. The more we learned and prayed about adoption, it seemed as if we were stepping into this incredible, beautiful story that God had already written for us. In December 2019, we grew our family through domestic newborn adoption. In truth, God has blessed me with the family I had always hoped for. He has shown me that His plan is truly the best. In the times I'm tempted to doubt God's plan, I just walk over to Xavier and give him a big kiss on his squishy little cheek. If things had gone the way I wanted initially in our marriage, he wouldn't have ended up in our lives. After adopting Xavier, we knew that we would enter the adoption process again. We believe love makes a family, and our family has so much room to grow and more love to give. We are currently in the process of working towards adopting a second child!

I am genuinely grateful for my time at Guerin Catholic. While there are many things I could say, I will simply close with this: I don't think that I am yet fully the person that God has made me to be, but I am on my way. The education and formation that I received at Guerin Catholic undoubtedly enabled me to begin boldly down the path of becoming that person.
